




Aggravated Assault in Selected Counties 2010-11



Larceny, Syracuse 2000-12















Motor Vehicle Theft in Selected Counties 2010-11



Index Crimes by Season, Syracuse 2011







Possession Marijuana, Syracuse 2000-12



Possession / Use of Drugs, Syracuse 2000-12





Sale/Manufacture of a Controlled Substance Syracuse 2000-12





Sale/Manufacture of Marijuana, Syracuse 2000-12




